Entry Deadline:	Registration for all entries closes Wednesday March 5, 2025, 11:59 PM. A late fee of \$40 will apply after Sunday March 2, 2025. Coaches and officials are required to register by Sunday March 2, 2025, <u>adminskiracing.com</u>
Lift Tickets:	Athletes lift tickets: Young Adult (13-22) \$69 Child (6-12) \$39. Parent tickets for athletes on the start list are \$109. <i>Ticket Link to be sent prior to all coaches and athletes</i> .

All race communication will be posted on Live-Timing and WhatsApp (coaches only). The SG start order will be a Team draw for training runs and a random draw for the race.
