Additional Information:

Access to the Pico Ski Club is limited to members and guests. Teams should utilize the Pico Base Lodge for storage, food and beverage and restroom facilities. Additionally, there is a small amount of bag storage available under the Pico Ski Club deck. *Please do not store any personal belongings on the ground along the walls of the club or on/near the ski racks.*

Free skiing is not available on either A Slope or B Slope. Free skiing should be accessed from the top of the LPT lift by skiing straight to Bushwacker which leads directly to Lower Pike.

Please follow Clean Hill Initiative protocols and do not leave bags, skis or tools inside of the fence. Drills should be holstered; no drills in the snow (upright/angled/flat).

In the event of accident or injury, race event staff will coordinate care with Killington and Pico Ski Patrol. If transport to a facility is required, transportation to Rutland Regional Medical Center can be coordinated with Regional Ambulance Service or by private vehicle (9.4 miles/15 minutes). Transportation to Killington Medical Center is by private vehicle only (6.3 miles/10 minutes). Helicopter service to Dartmouth Hitchcock Medical Center or University of Vermont Medical Center is available from RRMC.
